When Jesus rose from the dead and walked out of the tomb, he triggered a life-altering realignment of reality. The impact of resurrection created a shock wave that is still rippling through time since the very moment it happened. By rising from the dead, Jesus triumphed over sin and the curse of death to give us power to live as people who practice resurrection in all aspects of our lives.

I came across this phrase "Practice Resurrection" from a book by Eugene H. Peterson. Peterson's premise is that we are called to grow up in Christ and practice resurrection.

Here is a quote from Peterson' book: "One of the striking features of Paul's letters is the number of personal names that appear on the pages – eighty of them. Each of those eighty names links the message of the gospel to a particular man or woman growing up in Christ, practicing resurrection, while working for a living, raising a family, dealing with whatever political and economic conditions impinged on his or her life. Every word written on these pages has

been lived --- not just written or preached or taught or discussed, but lived in real-world conditions with all the factors of those conditions at play."

So my friends, we have a "cloud of witnesses" who have gone before us to show how to practice resurrection. We are the church now and we are to be people who are practitioners of resurrection. We are people who are growing in Christ-like character through the word of God, prayer and ministry that meets human needs with Christ.
