BURGSTAHLER FAMILY MINISTRY

The Burgstahler family relocated to Cape Town, South Africa in late 2014. They have been mentored by a South African pastor and his family since 1988. Although they first had their sights on Durban and the Zulu people in the eastern part of the country, they sensed God leading them to settle in the Cape Town area on the southwest coast. There, they have been learning the Afrikaans language, and becoming more familiar with the unique cultures found especially in the Western Cape Province.

South Africa has been marked for hundreds of years by systematic oppression of “non-white” people-groups. The skin-color-based Apartheid, or “apartness” government system was brought to an end only in 1994. While some think it is high-time to “get over” the past, it is unfortunately clearly evident that the structures and mindsets of racial and cultural divisiveness, and the consequent damage, still *dramatically* influence daily life and relationships today. The long 20+ years prove to be very short with respect to progress in this arena.

The Burgstahlers are positioned where they are of the minority both racially and culturally. Here, they find abundant opportunities to reach past these boundaries which still divide people, to invest themselves in intentional discipleship of followers of Jesus Christ, and to practice being “instruments of peace” to help facilitate “racial reconciliation” through Christ.

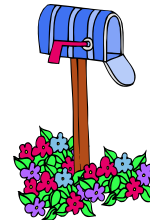

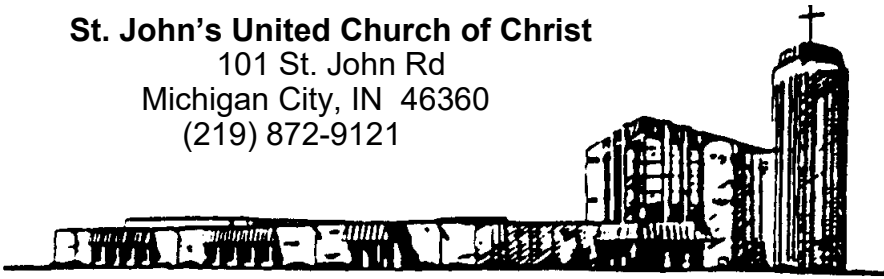
