"THE CALL OF CHRISTMAS"

The time was fulfilled and the Messiah was about to come into the world.

From Son into the world and He called certain individuals to fulfill roles which He assigned them.

During the Sundays of Advent we will focus on God's call to certain individuals. We will focus on four individuals who accepted God's call on their lives to be servants of the Lord's purpose. Each of the following individuals had distinct and separate callings. These callings were to *Prepare*, *Provide*, *Protect and Praise*.

On the first Sunday of Advent we will meet Zechariah the priest. Zechariah was called to *prepare* for what God was about to do. While burning incense to the Lord in the Temple, the angel Gabriel appeared and spoke the message that he and his wife Elizabeth would have a son. The Lord had heard Zechariah's prayer to be a father of a son and so he would be the father of John the Baptist. The Lord called Zechariah and Elizabeth to prepare John to honor God.

On the second Sunday of Advent we will meet Mary, the mother of Jesus. Mary was called to *provide* space for God's spirit within her womb. Mary would willingly provide herself as the Lord's handmaid after hearing the message from angel Gabriel.

On the third Sunday of Advent, we will meet Joseph the soon-to-be husband of Mary. Joseph received his call by an angel in a dream. Joseph was called to not be afraid to take Mary as his wife. The Lord wanted Joseph to *protect* Mary and keep this holy family safe.

On the fourth Sunday of Advent we will meet the shepherds. The shepherds were to receive an announcement of great joy from an angel which was the birth of the Savior. The glory of the Lord shone around them and they were given a sign which identified the Savior as a baby in a manger. The shepherds were compelled to find the baby and offer their *praise*. The shepherds were called to offer praise to God.

The call of Christmas goes out to all God's people. God calls ordinary people like you and me to accept and carry out holy tasks for the kingdom of God.




