

WHAT ARE CHRISMONS?

Over the years, the Christmas tree has become a symbol of Christ as the "Tree of Life." On our Christmas tree in the sanctuary, we have some Chrismons, made by ladies of our church some years ago and led by Mrs. Fine, Pastor Bill's mother.

Chrismons is a combination of the words "Christ" and "monograms" and represent the many symbols of Christ passed down to us through the ages. Since the early Christians often worshipped in secret to avoid possible persecution and death, they developed certain symbols, which hung on doors and buildings in order to communicate with fellow believers.

Chrismons are traditionally white and gold in color. White is the Liturgical (church) color for Christmas and symbolizes that Jesus was pure and perfect. Gold represents His Majesty and Glory.

Chrismons we have on our cross are: <u>The Cross:</u> symbolizes that Christians believe Jesus Christ died for everyone on a cross.


<u>The Triumphant Cross:</u> representing the earth with the cross on top and symbolizes how Jesus is triumphant over everything. <u>Five Pointed Star:</u> represents the five wounds of Jesus on the cross.

<u>The Crown</u>: is the symbol that Jesus is King and shows that Christians believe Jesus is ruler over heaven and earth.

The Dove: is the symbol of peace and the Holy Spirit. It points down to represent the Holy Spirit that appeared as a Dove when Jesus was baptized.

<u>The Chalice</u>: is the symbol of the blood Jesus shed on the cross for our sins, reminds us of the Sacrament of Holy Communion and represents God's forgiveness. $(cont'd \rightarrow)$ **The Angel:** reminds Christians of the angels who told the shepherds about the birth of Jesus. It can also represent the second coming of Jesus, which the Bible says will start with an angel blowing a trumpet.

The Lamb: is a symbol of Jesus, who is sometimes called "The Lamb of God." **The Fish:** is one of the oldest Christian symbols and one of the most popular. It was a secret symbol used by the early persecuted Christians to signify their belief in Jesus.
