

SOUP KITCHEN THANK YOU AND NEWS

St. John's Soup Kitchen Crew, working with St. Paul's, fed about 100 homeless on Sunday June 30. Thank you very much to all who volunteered!!

Since October, a loose network of local congregations has worked together to feed our homeless. Twice weekly, a truck brings to a distribution center some surplus groceries from local businesses. We work with Erik Tannehill of St. Paul to plan menus around the surplus available. We use our Missions budget-and our volunteers' contributions!—to supplement our portion of the surplus. With planning and volunteer effort, we serve healthy, balanced, often delightful meals to so many at a modest cost. Everyone who gives to St. John's has a part in this ministry! On June 30, after we fed the people, a surprise donation of food arrived from South Bend, delivered by a local resident who worships there. She knew about our network, and brought leftovers from a youth camp. That food, together with the leftovers from the lunch at St. Paul, went to Stepping Stone and Sand Castle before dinner, and to the Men's Shelter. Know that even the leftovers from the local surplus goes to good use!
