#### **VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL**

St. John's will host our fourth annual Michigan City Community Wide Vacation Bible School, July 24-28, 5-8 p.m.. This program brings nine local congregations together as an extended church family. We teach our faith in ways that work for kids.

This year's theme is "Maker Fun Factory—Created by God, Built for a Purpose." Registration opens for kids and volunteers on June 5 and will close on July 14. There is no cost. We expect we will easily meet our capacity of 160 kids, so register your kids early. We need about 90 volunteers total, and St. John's usually provides about a third of them. We need strong representation in our kitchen to prepare light meals and snacks the kids. We need crew leaders who will lead five or six kids each evening. We also need volunteers on the Security team to mind the doors and hallways.

As the host congregation, St. John's has a special role. We take very seriously the implementation of our Safe Church Policy for this event. We urge our VBS volunteers to contact our church office (872-9121) to sign up for our online course. You can complete this course in about 5 hours, in 20-30 minute segments, at times you find convenient. It's all about keeping our kids safe.
