

Celebration of Advent "Away in a Manger"

The Church is entrusted with a message to proclaim to the world. This message is about the incarnation of a messiah/Savior. God's only begotten Son came to earth as God in human form to save people from sin and death. Jesus' coming was prophesied by prophets so we might watch for Him and prepare to receive Him. It is our joy to remember Jesus and tell of the Good News of His life, death and resurrection.
