#### **CHURCH BOARD NEWS**

The Church Board has provided leadership throughout the years but there has never been a year quite like 2020. In fact, in 2021 we are still dealing with the effects of 2020. Your leaders have navigated through many challenges with deeper faith and exceedingly more trust in our Lord. We have learned to practice ministry in unprecedented ways due to unprecedented times. Now we have a better understanding of what it means to "live by faith and not by sight."

In light of so much change, the Board is exploring new funding streams to support our work for Christ. We have sought advice from the **United Church of Christ Building and Loan Fund** which assists churches with programs and services that help a congregation <u>plan</u>, <u>raise</u>, <u>finance</u>, and <u>build</u> projects that advance the mission of the church. The Building and Loan Fund presented a seminar to inform congregations about the possibility of renting space in their church building to generate income. The idea is to leverage the asset of our building, which is empty most of the week, to provide income to do ministry. We would choose what space would be available to rent as well as who would be an appropriate renter.

The Board has formed a working group which will explore the necessary steps required to make an informed decision. One of the first steps is to inform the congregation about this opportunity. Some of the exploratory steps include a survey of the congregation, a feasibility study, market analysis, pricing, legal and tax advice, and that is just a start. Over the coming months more information will be gathered and presented to you in anticipation of a congregational vote. Congregational approval will be needed to begin a more detailed study. As always, we encourage you to pray for leadership as we seek to discern God's will in these matters.
