### **EYES OF FAITH**

Sometimes people don't see eye to eye about certain issues. Many times this happens to husbands and wives. You may enjoy the following joke.

One of the weaknesses of our point of view is that we don't have all of the facts. Our perception may be limited by the amount of information available. The same is true for our eyesight.

No one prior to the invention of the electron microscope could see things that existed at the atomic or subatomic level. Just because we can't see them does not mean they don't exist. Our eyes are limited in focus. Before World War II, no one could ever imagine being able to see in the dark. Scientists since then have learned to energize photons so that through specialized equipment, you can see objects at night. Our eyes are limited by the amount of light needed to see in the dark.

Our eyes have another limitation, they cannot see into the spiritual realm. Does that mean that the spiritual realm does not exist? Of course not! We must look with eyes of faith to trust God, who is unseen

If you are interested, please sign up on the bulletin board nearest office.


