# "How Is Your Soul?" Becoming More Like Christ

Ephesians 4:13 ... until we all come to such unity in our faith and knowledge of God's Son that we will be mature in the suring up to the full and complete standard of

Lord, measuring up to the full and complete standard of Christ.

Each day is an opportunity to become more like Christ. Our heart's desire is that people will see Christ working in us and refining us. Christ's authority within us will influence the way we make decisions, respond to others, and behave in all situations. All of this is a reflection of our spiritual growth. So what is spiritual growth?

Spiritual growth is our daily pursuit of intimacy with Christ in all areas of our life. In response to God's love for us in Christ, we submit to his leadership in our life. We have to be intentional about spiritual growth. Spiritual growth doesn't just happen automatically; it requires an intentional choice. Each day we must choose to be like Jesus. We have a part to play in how deeply and how quickly we become like Jesus.

One way for Christ followers to check on each other is to ask, "How is your Soul?"

#### **CHRISTMAS IN SEPTEMBER??**



Yes, it's time to start working on Operation Christmas Child! We can all find a way to help make this year great by organizing packing parties, helping pack boxes, praying for God to bless this good work and donating the following items in the church library:

<u>Toys:</u> Include items that children will immediately embrace such as dolls, toy cars, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, balls, toys that light up and make noise (with extra batteries), etc.

<u>School Supplies</u>: pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

Non-Liquid Hygiene Items: toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths, etc.

Accessories: t-shirts, socks, hats, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries), etc.

<u>A Personal Note</u>: You may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. If you include your name and address, the child may be able to write back.

<u>Please Do Not Include</u>: Used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; out-of-date candy; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.

Also, we will gather on September 21st after the 10:00 service in Fellowship Hall and make twist band jewelry to include in our gift boxes. *Please join us, everyone welcome!!*
