As we know from Scripture the Son of God came into the world as Savior at a time of great darkness. He suffered everything a human being could possible suffer and overcame evil with an overpowering love. Jesus' love was a weapon that disarmed hatred, sin and death.

Christ's love is dispatched into the world through the Holy Spirit working through us. As followers of Christ we bear witness to His Word and Spirit.

Christ equips us to confront hatred and bigotry. Scripture reminds us that God created all human beings in God's image.

Genesis 1:26

²⁶ Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over al¹ the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth."

That image of God in all people is to be honored with dignity and love.

Hatred seeks to dehumanize the image of God in another person. Dehumanizing a person based on skin color, nationality, gender identity, or creed is the basis for racism. In obedience to God's word I encourage you to oppose racism which

defames the image of God in other persons.

In Christ we can build the bonds of love by the way we build relationships of understanding and peace. The personal wounds of hurt and anger that lead to racism need to be confessed and healed through an introduction to the love of Christ.

St. John recorded Jesus' prayer for His followers in John 17:20-21.

²⁰ "My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in Me through their message, ²¹ that all of them may be one, Father, just as You are in Me and I am in You. May they also be in Us so that the world may believe that You have sent Me.

A congregational meeting is being called for Sunday, September 17, 2017, at 10:30 a.m. in

Fellowship Hall.

The trustees have become aware of the instability of the cross affixed to the top of the tower. This matter must be addressed before winter weather arrives. The scope and cost of the Tower Project is as follows:

- 1. Remove cross.
- 2. Repair roof
- 3. Repair interior ceiling.
- 4. Construct an insulated interior ceiling in tower
- 5. Attach cross to east exterior side of tower.
- 6. Up-light the cross.
- 7. St. John's to remove TV control panel at base of tower.

The cost is expected to be \$10,245. We are asking the congregation to allocate \$13,000.


OFFICE HOURS NOTICE
